I hadn't planned to make a Print and Play of Song of Tales due to the necessity for some unusual bits and pieces, but a few people expressed an interest so I've put one together. This is very much a Work in Progress, much of the artwork is only partially complete, and all the graphic design and image manipulation is my own. I'm not great at graphic design and tend to hire somebody for the final product, so don't judge that too harshly please. This file contains all the cards needed to play with up to eight people, the rules should be nearby to where ever you found this.

## What You'll Need.


A 60 Second Sand Timer - You can play with as little as 30 seconds if you're feeling brave, but the timer must be one that you can flip and reverse the flow of, not a simple stop watch.

Up to 8 tokens per player, they should be identifiable from all the other player's markers, Euro-cubes are ideal if you can find them in enough colours.

A means of keeping score. The main rules will refer to a scoring track with meeples moving around it, but sets of D10 or a piece of paper will do fine so long as you remember to ignore the track references in the rules.







